

WELCOME TO THE INITIAL MEETING AT KINDERGARTEN

All parents in our kindergarten are offered an initial meeting with the staff before their child starts, in addition to development conversations held twice a year. The conversations in the kindergarten are confidential meetings between the parents and the pedagogical leader.

The kindergarten is committed to respecting parents' right to participation and to working in close cooperation and mutual understanding with the parents (Framework Plan for Kindergartens, chapter 5). As the Framework Plan emphasizes, cooperation between the kindergarten and the parents is crucial for the child's well-being and development. We therefore wish to facilitate good dialogue focused on what is best for the child.

The initial meeting is important because it gives the kindergarten staff valuable insight into the child's interests and needs before starting, and helps us to prepare for the child and the family during the settling-in period. You know your child best and can provide us with the information we need to meet your child in the best possible way. The information you share with us will help us to ensure high-quality interaction and contribute to the child's well-being and development.

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We encourage you to review the topics in advance so that both parties are well prepared for the conversation. Please feel free to bring the completed form with you to the meeting.
